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the 1910 revolution is still tangibly present in Mexico in the festivals that celebrate its victories on the monuments to its heroes and most important in the stories and memories of the Mexican people yet there has never been general agreement on what the revolution meant what its objectives were and whether they have been accomplished this pathfinding book shows how Mexicans from 1910 through the 1950s interpreted the revolution tried to make sense of it and through collective memory myth making and history writing invented an idea called la revolución in part one Thomas Benjamin follows the

historical development of different and often opposing revolutionary traditions and the state's efforts to forge them into one unified and unifying narrative in part two he examines ways of remembering the past and making it relevant to the present through fiestas monuments and official history this research clarifies how the revolution has served to authorize and legitimize political factions and particular regimes to the present day beyond the mexican case it demonstrates how history is used to serve the needs of the present

covers the period from 1968 to 1989

eric hobsbawm 1917 2012 wrote that latin america was the only region of the world outside europe which he felt he knew well and where he felt entirely at home he claimed this was because it was the only part of the third world whose two principal languages spanish and portuguese were within his reach but he was also of course attracted by the potential for social revolution in latin america after the triumph of fidel castro in cuba in january 1959 and even more after the defeat of the american attempt to overthrow him at the bay of pigs in april 1961 there was not an intellectual in europe or the usa he wrote who was not under the spell of latin america a continent apparently bubbling with the lava of social revolutions the third world brought the hope of revolution back to the first in the 1960s the two great international inspirations were cuba and vietnam triumphs not only of revolution but of davids against goliaths of the weak against the all powerful

this handbook on social movements revolution and social transformation analyzes people's struggles to bring about social change in the age of globalization it examines the origins nature dynamics and challenges of such movements as they aim to change dominant social economic and political institutions and structures across the globe departing from a theoretical introduction that explores major classical and contemporary theories of social movements and transformation the contributions collected here use a class based approach to examine key cases of social movements rebellions and revolutions worldwide from the turn of the twentieth to the early twenty first centuries against this wide ranging background the handbook concludes by charting the varied and competing future developments and trajectories of social movements revolutions and social transformations

in this uniquely wide ranging book david craven investigates the extraordinary impact of three latin american revolutions on the visual arts and on cultural policy the three great upheavals in mexico 1910 40 in cuba 1959 89 and in nicaragua 1979 90 were defining moments in twentieth century life in the americas craven discusses the structural logic of each movement s artistic project by whom how and for whom artworks were produced and assesses their legacies in each case he demonstrates how the consequences of the revolution reverberated in the arts and cultures far beyond national borders the book not only examines specific artworks originating from each revolution s attempt to deal with the challenge of socializing the arts but also the engagement of the working classes in mexico cuba and nicaragua with a tradition of the fine arts made newly accessible through social transformation craven considers how each revolution dealt with the pressing problem of creating a dialogical art one that reconfigures the existing artistic resource rather than one that just reproduces a populist art to keep things as they were in addition the author charts the impact on the revolutionary processes of theories of art and education articulated by such thinkers as john dewey and paulo freire the book provides a fascinating new view of the latin american revolutionaries from artists to political leaders who defined art as a fundamental force for the transformation of society and who bequeathed new ways of thinking about the relations among art ideology and class within a revolutionary process

the mexican revolution defined the sociopolitical experience of those living in mexico in the twentieth century its subsequent legacy has provoked debate between those who interpret the ongoing myth of the revolution and those who adopt the more middle of the road reality of the regime after 1940 taking account of these divergent interpretations this very short introduction offers a succinct narrative and analysis of the revolution using carefully considered sources alan knight addresses the causes of the upheaval before outlining the armed conflict between 1910 and 1920 explaining how a durable regime was consolidated in the 1920s and summing up the social reforms of the revolution which culminated in the radical years of the 1930s along the way knight places the conflict alongside other great revolutions and compares mexico with the latin american countries that avoided the violent upheaval about the series the very short introductions series from oxford university press contains hundreds of titles in almost every subject area these pocket sized books are the perfect way to get ahead in a new subject quickly our expert authors combine facts analysis perspective new ideas and enthusiasm to make interesting and challenging topics highly readable

in the twenty years of postrevolutionary rule in mexico the war remained fresh in the minds of those who participated in it while the enigmas of the revolution remained obscured demonstrating how textuality helped to define the revolution culture and revolution examines dozens of seemingly ahistorical artifacts to reveal the radical social shifts that emerged in the war s aftermath presented thematically this expansive work explores radical changes that resulted from postrevolution culture including new internal migrations a collective imagining of the future popular biographical narratives such as that of the life of frida kahlo and attempts to create a national history that united indigenous and creole elite society through literature and architecture while cultural production in early twentieth century mexico has been well researched a survey of the common roles and shared tasks within the various forms of expression has until now been unavailable examining a vast array of productions including popular festivities urban events life stories photographs murals literature and scientific discourse including fields as diverse as anthropology and philology horacio legrás shows how these expressions absorbed the idiosyncratic traits of the revolutionary movement tracing the formation of modern mexico during the 1920s and 1930s legrás also demonstrates that the proliferation of artifacts extending from poetry and film production to labor organization and political apparatuses gave unprecedented visibility to previously marginalized populations who ensured that no revolutionary faction would unilaterally shape mexico s historical process during these formative years

this book applies revolution in military affairs theories to explain the various strategic victories and losses for assorted social forces in colombia and mexico these countries form the ideal comparative case study of rma both from above by the state and below by civil society

the cuban revolution succeeded in 1959 in the face of official u s opposition an abortive bay of pigs invasion and an economic embargo cuban dependence on the united states dated to the u s occupation of the island from 1898 to 1901 and subsequent interventions in 1906 1909 1912 and 1917 historically the cuban economy has depended on the export of sugar before the revolution the united states imported the largest share of cuban sugar after 1960 the soviet union assumed this role and in exchange cuba had to import its fuel and some of its foodstuffs raw materials and capital goods

discussing the civilizatory crisis and processes of refeudalization this volume brings into dialogue two of the most creative approaches in olaf kaltmeier and edgardo lander to rethink capitalism in the 21st century in part 1 olaf kaltmeier takes issue with the state of social inequality in the region highlighting the concentration of wealth within the upper 1 of society in latin america comparing the current economic situation with the ancient regime the discussion centers around the new phenomena like billionaires as president increased luxury consumption an emerging culture of distinction and the intensification of land and spatial segregation in part 2 lander urgently assesses the current state and political legacy of the pink tide governments in his essay crisis of civilization reviewing the past two

decades of the new millennium lander critiques the failure of these governments to provide alternatives to extractivism and economic dependencies finally hans jürgen burchardt connects the arguments through interviews where both authors sum their efforts to open the issues to future dialogue refeudalization in latin america provides an accessible and thought provoking political diagnosis from the global south which departs from the oft idiosyncratic and cyclical debates of the global north to offer new vocabulary for social change it will interest scholars and students of global studies sociology and political science

movements after revolution is a history of the people s movements in the aftermath of the mexican revolution of 1910 20 that brought together industrial workers and rural communities to fight for a vast array of demands and diverse forms of justice

in 1999 venezuela became the first country in the world to constitutionally recognize the socioeconomic value of housework and enshrine homemakers social security this landmark provision was part of a larger project to transform the state and expand social inclusion during hugo Chávez s presidency the bolivarian revolution opened new opportunities for poor and working class or popular women s organizing the state recognized their unpaid labor and maternal gender role as central to the revolution yet even as state recognition enabled some popular women to receive public assistance it also made their unpaid labor and organizing vulnerable to state appropriation offering the first comprehensive analysis of this phenomenon engendering revolution demonstrates that the bolivarian revolution cannot be understood without comprehending the gendered nature of its state society relations showcasing field research that comprises archival analysis observation and extensive interviews these thought provoking findings underscore the ways in which popular women sustained a movement purported to exalt them even while many could not access social security and remained socially economically and politically vulnerable

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
